



During the month of September, the speech therapists have been busy getting to know their speech students and their current goals and objectives. The speech therapists at Whiton service students from preschool through third grade with Individualized Education Programs, consult with teachers, conduct evaluations and play an active role in other school and district wide programs. Students receiving speech or language services work on speech sounds and overall language and social communication skills throughout the school year. Some fun language activities caregivers can reinforce at home include:

- n Answering riddles (I come in handy when leaves fall off the trees).
- n Naming three items in a category (Name 3 community helpers).
- n Answering "WHEN" questions (When do you go to the doctor?)
- n Discussing similes and idioms (Brandon stood like a statue on the stage).
- n Cause and effect sentences (Jared forgot to feed his cat. The cat is _____).


“What could the students have done differently?” I was so impressed with the quality of the students’ responses. Here are a few:

Our All Star Citizens are going to have a banner year in second grade!



Ms. Sydlowski and Miss Cook's Science Class




Kindergarten Learns the Whiton Ways


